Dear Mr. Brandt:

The predesign report for the new proposed LOSS was received on July 31st, 2020.

We have determined that the conceptual design for the LOSS appears to be viable. This letter is your notification to proceed to site inspection per WAC 246-272B-02000, with the following comments.

- Your proposed LOSS is located above or near a Critical Aquifer Recharge Area (CARA). You may be required to provide additional treatment including nitrogen treatment. This requirement will be confirmed during the Environmental Review process.
- You must contact DAHP to confirm there are no concerns related to Tribal or Archaeological artifacts. At a minimum you will be required to implement an inadvertent discovery plan during all site work.

The fee for a site inspection, \$1000.00. Please submit your check, payable to the Department of Health with the enclosed invoice.

If you fail to obtain all required approvals before construction, you will be subject to enforcement action, which may include civil penalties as authorized by chapter 70.118B RCW. Washington State Department of Health is under no obligation to accept or approve any component installed or constructed prior to approval. You may be required to expose system

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components for our inspection and rebuild/replace, if necessary, to meet LOSS rule requirements.
